Over-the-counter-medication for pain

Pain medication is particularly risky in older patients with multiple diseases. How high is the use of prescription- and over-the-counter pain medication and which risks occur? In the MultiCare Study we were able to show that over one third of patients took pain medication regularly or as needed. Even though the use of OTC pain medication was not low, the proportion of parallel medication, overdoses or interactions due to OTC use was relatively small.
