Dear family physicians and internal specialists working as family physicians,

the Institue of General Practice and Family Medicine at Jena University Hospital conducts a federal founded research project

SAVOIR to evalutate Specialized Outpatient Palliative Care (SOPC) Directive (01VSF16005).





For the purpose of SAVOIR we perform a nationwide survey of family physicians to investigate medical treatment and palliative care offered or prescribed by family physicians at the interface of general and special ambulatory palliative care (SOPC and AOPC) which by now is widely unexplored.

From your answers we will derive clues for the future development of the family physicians' role in AOPC and SOPC. These will also be considered for the improvement of the SOPC Directive.

Research news

External international comitee counsils research in project intersec-CM

Since 1st of August 2017 the institute for general practice and family medicine conducts research in a BMBF-project on medical care for elderly people with cognitive impairment during and after discharge from hospital collaborating with German Center for Neurodegenerative Diseases, the Institute for Community Medicine at the University of Greifswald and the clinic for geriatric psychiatry at Evangelisches Klinikum Bethel in Bielefeld. In a randomized-controlled trial is

explored up to what extent an intersectoral care management is improving this transition. Our institute conducts a process evaluation, to analyze and record, which influencing factors facilitate and which inhibit implementation of this type of care management under routine conditions. On 30th of January we took part in the first meeting of the scientific advisory board of intersec-CM and received excellent input by an external international committee of prestigious scientists.

Centre of competence for postgraduate training general practice and family medicine

Since 2017 the institute for general practice and family medicine is part of the new founded centre of competence for postgraduate training general practice in Thuringia. Together with the Association of Statutory Health Insurance Physicians Thuringia, the State Chamber of Physicians of Thuringia and the Federal Society for Hospitals Thuringia we establish, based on currently established structures, a postgraduate training for general practice and family medicine in Thuringia. Relevant elements are a follow-up seminar, a mentoringprogram for the physicians taking the postgraduate training, train-the-trainer seminars and continuous evaluation of the training. We understand the competence centre a great chance to establish an efficient, high-quality and reliable training for future family physicians.

impfen6o+ Second representative survey

In the course of the successful start of the information campaign Vaccination60+, the second representative survey with citizens took Psychologists and communication scientists from Erfurt University explored, thuringians aged 60 and over evaluated the campaign, if knowledge vaccinations and their attitude towards vaccination changed and why or why not they got vaccinated.

2nd meeting of health services research at Jena University Hospital

On 29th of november 2017 24 colleagues from Jena University Hospital, who engage in health services research, met for the second time at the Institute of General Practice and Family Medicine. Besides a discussion on current announcements of research grants in the field of health services research, several participants presented their projects.

The participants agreed that that the insights in the activities of colleagues in this field as well as the critical and constructive discussions of the presented trial designs were gainful and inspiring. The next meeting has already been set.
