Looking back on the seminar program of the Competence Centre for Further Training

The past seminar days offered a colourful program to the participants joining in at the Competence Centre for Further Training. At the end of August, Prof. Axer, neurologist from the Jena University Hospital, demonstrated tips and tricks for neurological differential diagnostics in GP care. This was followed by advice on the contents to be covered during travel consultations given by Mrs Stula, family practitioner in Weimar. To wind up the day, a lively round of questions and answers about prescribing allied health visits and durable medical equipment was directed by Dr Möckel from the Thuringian Asso-

ciation of Statutory Health Insurance Physicians.

The seminar day in October started with exercises on how to convey difficult news guided by Mrs Scheibe, psychotherapist from Dresden. An entertaining lecture was given by Dr Rommeiß, forensic pathologist from the Jena University Hospital, addressing the pitfalls involved in post-mortem examinations and providing many practical hints. The day was completed by explanations on visual diagnosis in ENT given by Dr Lundershausen from an otorhinolaryngologic practice in Erfurt.

Research news

DEGAM highlights in retrospect

This year, the 53rd Congress of General Praciticioners and Family Physicians had invited its participants to the Franconian city of Erlangen. Employees from this institute were also in attendance, and presented research results on posters, during "one slide five minutes" lectures, or in a symposium. Inga Petruschke showed the results obtained by a student survey on the outpatient elective quarter during the practical year, and the results of "RAI ambulant". Acting in representation for Michael Sommer, she also presented an outlook on the PJenAmbulant2020 project involving blended learning during the tertial on general medicine. Antje Freytag gave a report on the factors influencing the scope of palliative care provided by general practitioners. The study results were generated by a Germany-wide survey conducted as part of the SAVOIR project.

Workshop to conclude the "vaccination60+" project

To complete the "vaccination60+" cooperative project promoting the willingness of elderly people to be vaccinated in Thuringia, a final workshop was held on 19 September 2019. Representatives from federal and state health ministries, from the Federal Centre for Health Education, from Robert Koch Institute, from health insurance funds, and from other authorities and foundations active in providing patient information met in Erfurt on this occasion. Apart from a presentation of the project results by the study team, participants attended consecutive workshops to learn more about the bandwidth covered by campaign development. The topics ranged from addressing target group specific circumstances which prevent vaccination, to evidence-informed campaign design and evaluation concept design. As confirmed by the final evaluation of the workshop, the participants, some of them actively running information campaigns themselves, received a number of valuable impulses for their own practical work. Physician health

Physician wellbeing was the central topic addressed on this year's American Conference on Physician Health organised by the AMA in Charlotte from 19 to 21 September. In this context, wellbeing should not be confused with the German usage of the word "wellness" which rather refers to a spa feeling as the prevalence of illness and especially of psychological disorders including, e.g., depression or burnout, is high among physicians. Many well-being programs were presented on the conference to address these problems on individual, institutional, and systemic levels. Treatment of uncomplicated urinary tract infections - REDARES

The purpose of REDARES is to contribute to the adequate treatment of uncomplicated urinary tract infections in accordance with the guidelines during outpatient care. The scope of this study covers the effects of a complex intervention comprising the provision of local resistance data, revised guideline recommendations, and personalised prescription feedback.

Beginning in the summer of 2020, the Institute for General Practice and Family Medicine in Jena will become involved in the study's performance in Thuringia, while it will start with the accompanying evaluation of the feasibility and acceptance of the intervention right away.
